

Travel Medicine Payment Information

- Travel medicine visits and immunizations are not covered by most health insurance plans. Due to this, travel medicine services must be paid in advance.
- A typical visit to a travel clinic involves:
 - A fee for the 30-minute office visit.
 - A fee for each immunization.
 - A fee for administering each immunization.
- Vaccine and administration fees are determined following your visit with the provider. These fees can vary based on the type and quantity of vaccinations needed.
- The clinic will provide a receipt and information that patients can submit to their insurance for reimbursement if covered.
- The patient will speak with the doctor about their travel plans and immunization needs.
- The patient will receive a cost estimate from the clinic team for the recommended vaccinations.
- Patients will pay the office visit portion at their time of service. At that time, patients may choose to pay for the vaccines and receive the vaccinations as part of that visit. Patients with health savings account (HSA) debit/credit cards may use HSA funds for our travel services.
- Patients may also elect to receive their vaccines elsewhere or schedule a visit with the clinic at a future date.
